

UAE consulate in Hyderabad to be inaugurated on June 14

In a major relief to visa applicants, United Arab Emirates (UAE) is going to inaugurate a consulate office in Hyderabad. Though the consulate office located in Banjara Hills began its operation six months ago, it began offering consular services in only in April and is now set to be inaugurated on June 14. Consul Gen-eral of UAE in Hyderabad Aaref Alnuaim said that this step was taken owing to a huge demand for visas from Hyderabad, adding that several UAE citizens travel to Hyderabad for medical and educational reasons. The consulate is originally set up to process 200 applications per day, but there are plans to increase this to 500 applications per day over the next few months. "The number of visas processed will eventually be increased to 700—

800 visas per day," Aaref Alnuaim was quoted as saying by a news report.

Oil India Limited (OIL), on May 26 declared its financial results for FY 2022-23 with a thumping highest-ever net profit since the company's inception at Rs 6,810.40 crore, a surge of 75.20% YoY on the back of higher operating income and growth in oil & gas production.

During the last fiscal, the company also reported the highest-ever pipeline throughput of 8.19 MMT. Also, the highest-ever turnover of Rs 23,272.57 crore, a rise of 60.17% YoY.

It is pertinent to mention here that OIL over the last 6 decades, has continued its journey of growth in oil & gas

production from its matured and recently discovered oilfields during the last fiscal, with 5.5% growth in oil production at 3.18 MMT and 4.4% growth in gas production at 3.18 BCM, which scaled another height of registering the highest ever gas production by the company ever since its inception. The earnings per share (EPS) of the company has increased to Rs 62.80/share vs Rs 35.85/share in FY22. OIL Board has declared the final dividend of Rs 5.50 per share with a total dividend of Rs 20/share (face value Rs 10) for FY23. As for Q4FY23, the company equally reported improved financial & physical performance over Q4FY22, with turnover growth of 26.15% and a PAT increase of 9.71%. Crude Oil and Natural Gas production has also shown growth of 6.95% and 6.27% respectively in Q4FY23 YoY. Country's largest iron ore producer, NMDC declared its FY23 results today. In the financial year 2022-23, the company produced 40.82 million tonnes and sold

38.22 million tonnes of iron ore. NMDC is the first iron ore producer in India to cross the 40 MnT production mark for the second consecutive fiscal. Government of India's profit making PSE recorded a turnover of Rs.17667 crore, with Profit Before Tax (PBT) at Rs.7637 crore and Profit After Tax (PAT) at Rs.5529 crore in FY23. The mining major has also announced 2nd and final dividend of Rs.2.85 per share. The total dividend including 1st interim dividend (Rs.3.75 per share) is Rs.6.6 per share for FY23. Concluding the year with a strong performance, NMDC registered iron ore production of

14.13 MnTand sales of 12.41 MnT in the fourth quarter of

FY23 which is the highest for any quarter since inception. For Q4 of the financial year, turnover stood at Rs.5851 crore while PBT and PAT clocked Rs.3285 crore and Rs.2277 crore respectively. Want to Stay Strong as You Age? Flavonol-rich Foods Like Blackberries and Apples Can Help



When it comes to health, there are certain things you expect to happen as you age, like a decline in physical fitness, hearing loss, and the development of frailty. Now, new research has found that eating flavonol-rich foods, like apples and blackberries, may lower your chances of developing the latter. The study, conducted at the Marcus Institute for Aging Research, found that for every 10mg higher intake of flavonols per day, the odds of developing frailty - a condition

that carries a greater risk of falls, fractures, disability, hospitalization, and mortality and affects approximately 10-15% of older adults - were reduced by 20%.

In particular, the study concluded that foods like apples and blackberries that contain flavonoids called quercetin may be the most important for frailty prevention. Commenting on the findings, the study authors said in a press release: "There may be some validity to the old saying, an apple a day keeps the doctor (or frailty) away." The researchers also noted that "individuals can easily consume 10mg of flavonols intake per day since one mediumsized apple has about 10 mg of flavonols.

Flavonols and frailty: What's the link?

"Flavonols are one of 6 compounds that form part of the larger family of compounds known as flavonoids," explained Dr. Shireen Kassam, co-founder of Plant Based Health Online. "This family of compounds is found in a wide variety of fruits and vegetables and in general they act as antioxidants in the body, protecting cells from oxidative stress by free radicals."

Kassam noted that the consumption of flavonol-rich foods is associated with lower levels of inflammation and cellular stress resulting in a lower risk of various chronic conditions, including: ·cardiovascular disease · type 2 diabetes · cancer · dementia Where frailty is concerned, Kathleen Benson, a registered dietitian at Top Nutrition ,Coachingsaid flavonols prevent its development in several ways. "Frailty is a condition that is most common with aging and signifies a general decline in physical function. There are a number of features that are typical of frailty, including loss of muscle mass, weight loss, difficulty mobilizing, and fatigue," she noted. While the exact understanding of how flavonols work in the body is still being researched, Benson said a variety of experiments have shown that flavonoids have antiallergic, anti-inflammatory, antiviral, and antioxidant properties that may provide protection against frailty.

She noted that flavonols work alongside other phytonutrients in a variety of mechanisms across the body. "Quercetin - one of the most researched flavonoids - for example, may help with age-related disorders, due to its potent antioxidant properties and how it works synergistically with other nutrients. Put simply, this means that quercetin naturally helps other chemical processes in the body do their job," Benson explains.

How Medical Cannabis Can Improve Your Quality of Life if You Have Chronic Pain

Many people with cancer-related pain, chronic pain, or other health conditions turn to medical cannabis to relieve their symptoms.

Now recent research has found that cannabis products may also improve their overall quality of life. This can happen even without changes in pain levels, said Dr. Wei Du, codirector of Drexel University's Medical Cannabis Research Center in Philadelphia.

For example, when asked about their pain level, patients may say, "My pain is high, but I still manage to go to work and enjoy time with my family," he told Healthline. Other times, their pain level may be low, but they can have difficulty functioning in their daily life due to their illness.

Measuring quality of life versus pain management- The authors of a recent study in the journal focused on the impact of medical cannabis on patients' quality of life across a number of areas. Du said that given how patients' symptoms may not be an accurate reflection of their overall functioning, patient-reported outcomes such as quality of life can be useful in understanding how medical cannabis benefits people.

In the study, researchers measured health-related quality of life in more than 3,100 Australian patients who were treated with medical cannabis at a network of specialist medical clinics between 2018 and 2022. The average age of patients at the first study visit was 56 years, over half were female, and around one-third were employed. Chronic noncancer pain was the most common reason for using medical cannabis, as reported by over two-thirds of patients. Smaller numbers of patients used medical cannabis for cancer pain, insomnia, and anxiety. In addition, the most common medications at the first visit were opioid and non-opioid pain medications, the latter used by around half of patients. Some people also reported using antidepressants, benzodiazepines, or other medications.

The researchers did not report on medication usage at the end of the study, so it's not known if treatment with medical cannabis helped patients reduce their use of other medications. By the end of the study period, 80% of monthly cannabis prescriptions were for products that were dominant in CBD, with most of these taken orally as oils or capsules. The rest of the products were either dominant in THC or contained a balance of THC and CBD. "A very small proportion of patients used inhaled forms [of medical cannabis]," said Jason Busse, DC, Ph.D., a professor of anesthesia and associate director of the Michael G. DeGroote Centre for Medicinal Cannabis Research at McMaster University in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. "This is comforting in a sense," he told Healthline, "because when you're using an oil-filled capsule, you're not going to take on any of the potential pulmonary harms seen with inhaling cannabis."

The Youth Mental Health Crisis **Needs Our Attention**



The headlines are difficult to ignore these days. One cannot help but feel a bit of anxiety when consuming the state of our affairs in the news — war, climate, and the economy.

So you may turn to social media instead for an escape?

Perhaps consuming manicured images or videos of travel, food, and design can help you feel less anxious. We forget though that this constant intake of information, regardless of the attributes, can be an overload that can further create stress.. As adults, we have had some years of practice to regulate and gate our emotions and thoughts from our daily intake of information, but yet, more of us are overwhelmed than ever before. According to an American Psychiatric Association study at the end of 2022, 37% of Americans rated their mental health being fair or poor, up from 31% the year before.

If the adults are feeling this way, what about our children?
This brings me to the topic of our kids. How are they to navigate amidst our current state of affairs? Our children have had information overload coming out of the pandemic in addition to the constant change in their routines with school closures. The Surgeon General has described mental health as the "defining public health crisis of our time" and made a mission to address the health crisis that is defining a generation. A recent CDC report Trusted Sources showed the alarming increased statistics of Emergency Department-related visits associated with mental health diagnoses - anxiety, eating disorders, depression, etc. The call to action for many in the healthcare space is to advocate for solutions that help to prevent, identify, and address these issues in our youths before they are in crisis mode. I wholeheartedly agree with this approach so that we can bring the right resources to improve the infrastructure for education and literacy, access improvement, and programming development.

But more than anything, we need to address that access to devices and social media at a young age can result in the culmination of what we are seeing today in our preteens and teens.

WHO Says Avoid These Non-Sugar Sweeteners if You Want to Lose Weight - The World Health Organization recommends against using sugar substitutes to help with weight loss, or to reduce the risk of diet-related diseases such as heart disease and diabetes.

In new guidance released May 15, the global health body said a review of the available evidence suggests that use of non-sugar sweet-eners "does not confer any long-term benefit in reducing body fat in adults or children.

Non-sugar sweetener do not help with long-term weight loss

Evidence from randomized controlled trials included in the review showed that while non-sugar sweeteners may help people lose weight over the short term, the changes are not sustained. The review also suggests that there may be "potential undesirable effects" from long-term use of non-sugar sweeteners, "such as an increased risk of type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular diseases and mortality in adults.

Non-sugar sweeteners are widely used as an ingredient in beverand prepackaged foods. Consumers can also add them to foo and drinks. In 2015 the WHO issued guidance on sugar intake, recommending that adults and children reduce their daily intake of added sugars to less than 10% of their total energy intake. Since then, interest in non-sugar sweeteners has increased, the new review said.

"As a registered dietitian-nutritionist in practice for more than 40 years, I can certainly attest to the fact that those consuming diet sodas and using sugar substitutes do not necessarily successfully lose excess weight and/or maintain a healthful weight," Mindy Haar, assistant dean at New York Institute of Technology's School of Health Professions, told Healthline. "This [guidance] is a great move," Samantha M. Coogan, a registered dietitian and program director of the Didactic Program in Nutrition & Dietetics at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, told Healthline. "More often than not, [non-sugar sweeteners] have more side effects than benefits," she said. For example, "they're often not well-tolerated in the [gastrointestinal] tract and lead to bloating and diarrhea." In addition, many sugar substitutes a hundreds of times sugar. "This potentially leads to other sweetened foods tasting more bland," said Coogan, "causing people to crave sweeter and sweeter foods for the same satisfaction level."





भारत को मिल सकता है 'NATO प्लस' का दर्जा : अमेरिकी कांग्रेस कमेटी की सिफारिश



ताइवान में चीन की दबंगई पर लगाम कसने और उसकी घेराबंदी के लिए अमेरिका अब भारत को मजबूत साझेदार के रूप में देख रहा है। अमेरिकी कांग्रेस की सेलेक्ट कमेटी ने भारत को 'नाटो प्लस' का दर्जा देने की सिफारिश की है। नाटो प्लस में अभी पांच देश हैं, कमेटी की सिफारिश मंजूर हुई तो भारत इसका छठा सदस्य बन जाएगा।

कमेटी का मानना है कि चीन ताइवान पर हमला करता है तो सामरिक तौर पर कड़ा जवाब देने के साथ-साथ क्वॉड को भी अपनी भूमिका बढ़ानी होगी। क्वॉड चार देशों का सहयोगी संगठन है जिसमें भारत, अमेरिका, ऑस्ट्रेलिया और जापान हैं। चीन से मुकाबले के लिए अमेरिका को G-7 के देशों के साथ भी सहयोग को और मजबूत करना होगा।

जनवरी में गठित कमेटी ने ताइवान पर अपनी पहली रिपोर्ट और सिफारिशें जारी की हैं। कमेटी की सिफारिशों की टाइमिंग अहम है क्योंकि प्रधानमंत्री नरेंद्र मोदी की 21 जून से अमेरिका की यात्रा प्रस्तावित है।

भारत को मिलेगी बेहतर डिफेंस टेक्नोलॉजी— 'नाटो प्लस' देशों को अमेरिकी डिफेंस इंडस्ट्री और टेक्नोलॉजी की बेहतर उपलब्धता मिलती है। 'नाटो प्लस' में आने से भारत को भी चुनिंदा देशों के जैसे बेहतर अमेरिकी डिफेंस टेक्नोलॉजी मिल सकेगी। फिलहाल अमेरिका—भारत में कोई डिफेंस समझौता या डील नहीं है। लेकिन अमेरिका ने भारत को अहम डिफेंस पार्टनर का दर्जा दिया हुआ है। इससे भारत को संवेदनशील तकनीक का निर्यात हो रहा है।

कमेटी की सिफारिशों को डिफेंस एक्ट में शामिल करना होगा-

कमेटी की सिफारिश के बाद भारत को 'नाटो प्लस' का दर्जा देने के लिए पहली कड़ी के रूप में डिफेंस एक्ट में शामिल कर आधिकारिक रूप से कानून बनाना होगा। फिर सीनेट और अंतिम मंजूरी राष्ट्रपति जो बाइडेन की ओर से जारी की जाएगी।

मजबूत पक्षः बाइडेन भारत के पक्ष में हैं। चीन के साथ हालिया विवादों के चलते एशिया में वे भारत के साथ और मजबूत रिश्ते चाहते हैं। जनरल माइक मिनेहन भी भारत से सहयोग के पक्षधर हैं।

आशंकाः सीनेट की विदेश मामलों की कमेटी के अध्यक्ष बॉब मेनेन्डेज की ओर से बाधा की आशंका है। वह भारत-रूस एस 400 मिसाइल डिफेंस सिस्टम खरीद समझौते के विरोधी हैं।

रूस-यूक्रेन जंग पिछले 15 महीनों से जारी है। इस बीच रूस ने जेलेंस्की का हॉलिडे पेंटहाउस बेचने का फैसला किया है। उसने यूक्रेन के राष्ट्रपति वोलोदिमीर जेलेंस्की के इस घर के साथ ही 57 प्रॉपर्टीज को सरकारी संपत्ति घोषित कर दिया है। जेलेंस्की का ये घर उनकी पत्नी ओलेना जेलेंस्का के नाम पर है। ये क्रीमिया में ब्लैक सी के तट पर बना हुआ है।

क्रीमिया के स्पीकर ब्लादिमीर कॉन्सटैंटिनोव ने कहा— हम इस घर को बेचने की सूचना जारी करेंगे। इससे मिलने वाले पैसों का इस्तेमाल यूक्रेन में चल रहे स्पेशल मिलिट्री ऑपरेशन और जंग में मारे गए सैनिकों के परिवारों के लिए इस्तेमाल किया जाएगा। जेलेंस्की का पेंटहाउस बेचने पर रूसी नेता ने कहा कि क्रीमिया रूस का हिस्सा है। हम यहां की संपत्ति से रूस के दुश्मनों को मुनाफा नहीं होने देंगे। रूस जंग के दौरान अपनी मिलिट्री पर 7 लाख करोड़ से ज्यादा रूपए खर्च कर चुका है।

जेलेंस्की की पत्नी ने 2013 में खरीदा था पेंट्राउस, अब इसकी कीमत साढ़े 6 करोड़— राष्ट्रपति जेलेंस्की की पत्नी ओलेना जेलेंस्का ने 2013 में क्रिमिया के लिवादिया शहर में 3 कमरे का एक पेंट्राउस खरीदा था। तब इसकी कीमत करीब 1 करोड़ 35 लाख रुपए थी। इसके ठीक एक साल बाद 2014 में रूस ने क्रीमिया पर कब्जा कर लिया था। जेलेंस्का कमी भी इस घर का इस्तेमाल नहीं कर पाईं क्योंकि इसमें अभी रेनोवेशन का काम बचा हुआ था। रूसी स्टेट मीडिया ने अब इस घर की कीमत करीब साढ़े 6 करोड़ रुपए बताई है।

क्रीमिया में 65 प्रतिशत लोग रूसी मूल के, जबकि 15 प्रतिशत लोग यूक्रेनी-

यूक्रेन साल 1991 में आजाद हुआ था। क्रीमिया हमेशा से यूक्रेन का हिस्सा नहीं था, बल्कि एक सोवियत नेता ने तोहफे के तौर पर इसे यूक्रेन को सौंपा था। क्रीमिया में 65 प्रतिशत लोग रूसी मूल के हैं, जबिक 15 फीसदी यूक्रेनी मूल के लोगों की है। साल 2010 में यूक्रेन ने रूस के साथ समझौता किया, जिसके तहत रूसी सेना के बेड़े को 25 साल तक क्रीमिया में रहने की इजाजत दी गई। इसके बदले रूस ने गैस की कीमतें 30 फीसदी कम कर दीं।

चांद पर पहुंचने के लिए दो अरबपतियों में रेस



इंसान को फिर से चांद पर पहुंचाने की रेस शुरू हो चुकी है। नांसा ने एलक मस्क की स्पेस एक्स के बाद अब अरबपति जेफ बेजोस की कंपनी ब्लू ओरिजिन के साथ भी 3.4 बिलियन डॉलर, यानी २८ हजार करोड़ का कॉन्ट्रैक्ट साइन किया है। बेजोस की स्पेस एक्सप्लोरेशन कंपनी ब्लू ओरिजिन ने खुद ये कॉन्ट्रैक्ट मिलने की पृष्टि की है। कॉन्ट्रैक्ट 'आर्टिमिस अ मिशन' के तहत दिया गया है। जो नासा का इंसान को फिर से चांद पर भेजने का महत्वाकांक्षी प्रोजेक्ट है। इससे अमेरिका की दो बड़ी कंपनियों के बीच कॉम्पिटिशन शुरू हो गया है।

नासा को चांद पर जाने के लिए लूनर लैंडर चाहिए

न्यूयॉर्क टाइम्स की रिपोर्ट के मुताबिक नासा ने 3.4 बिलियन डॉलर के बदले एक लूनर लैंडर की मांग की है, जो एक 50 फीट के स्पेस क्राफ्ट का हिस्सा होगा। इसे ब्लू मून कहा गया है। मिशन को 2029 में लॉन्च किया जाएगा। इसके जरिए 4 एस्ट्रोनॉट्स को चांद की सरफेस पर उतारा जाएगा।

इसके जरिए नासा चांद के साउथ पोल को एक्सप्लोर करना चाहता है। नासा के अधिकारी ने इस कॉन्ट्रैक्ट पर कहा कि हम ज्यादा से ज्यादा कॉम्पिटिशन चाहते हैं, ताकि हमारा एक प्रोग्राम फेल हो तो हमारे पास उसका बैकअप तैयार रहे।

नासा के चांद तक पहुंचने के 5 मिशन को जानें-

आर्टिमिस 1- नासा के मून मिशन के लिए एक टेस्ट फ्लाइट है, जिसमें किसी अंतरिक्ष यात्री को नहीं भेजा गया था। इस फ्लाइट के साथ वैज्ञानिकों का मकसद चांद पर एस्ट्रोनॉट्स के लिए सही हालात सुनिश्चित करना है। मिशन के तहत नासा ds SLS मेगा रॉकेट के जिए ओरियन क्रू कैप्सूल चंद्रमा के बेहद करीब पहुंचेगा, लेकिन लैंड नहीं करेगा।

आमतौर पर क्रू कैप्सूल में एस्ट्रोनॉट्स रहते हैं, लेकिन इस बार यह खाली है। मिशन 25 दिन 11 घंटे और 36 मिनट का है, जिसके बाद यह धरती पर वापस आ जाएगा। स्पेसक्राफ्ट कुल 20 लाख 92 हजार 147 किलोमीटर का सफर तय करेगा।

आर्टिमिस 2- मिशन के तहत ओरियन कैप्सूल 4 एस्ट्रोनॉट्स को पृथ्वी से इतनी दूर ले जाएगा जहां आज तक इंसान नहीं गए हैं। ये 10 दिन का मिशन होगा। जो चांद के पास से गुजरेगा और पृथ्वी पर लौटेगा। इस मिशन के तहत स्पेस क्राफ्ट की क्षमता को जांचा जाएगा।

आर्टिमिस 3- तीसरे आर्टिमिस मिशन के तहत दो एस्ट्रोनॉट्स को चांद तक ले जाया जाएगा। इसमें एक महिला होगी। ये मिशन ऐतिहासिक होगा। इसकी वजह ये है कि इस मिशन के जरिए दुनिया की पहली महिला चांद पर कदम रखेगी। चांद के साउथ पोल पर एस्ट्रोनॉट्स एक हफ्ते तक रहेंगे। आर्टिमिस 4- मिशन के जरिए नासा दूसरी बार इंसान को चांद पर ले जाएगा। इस बार एस्ट्रोनॉट्स का चांद पर स्टे ज्यादा दिनों के लिए होगा। इस मिशन में पहला अश्वेत एस्ट्रोनॉट भी शामिल होगा।

Sourav Ganguly caught in Bengal power play over bid to bat for Tripura Tourism



Tripura is about to get its own "Maharaj", after the BJP-led state government Tuesday announced former Indian cricket captain Sourav Ganguly, nicknamed "Maharaj", as the brand ambassador of its tourism department. This is a choice that was bound to create a stir in West Bengal because more than a decade since his retirement Ganguly remains an iconic figure in his home state.

On Tuesday, Tripura tourism minister Sushanta Chowdhury announced the appointment after meeting Ganguly at his

Kolkata residence. In a social media post later that day, Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha wrote: "It's a matter of great pride that former captain of Indian cricket team Sourav Ganguly has accepted our proposal to be the Brand Ambassador of Tripura Tourism."

In no time, it opened the floodgates of allegations and counter-allegations in Bengal, where the ruling Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress (TMC) and the opposition BJP have been locked in a battle of political one-upmanship since 2016, when the BJP first began eyeing electoral control over the state.

On and off the field, Ganguly has been no stranger to controversy. The former BCCI chief has also been known for his proximity to various stakeholders across the political spectrum.

Once close to former Siliguri MLA Ashok Bhattacharya of the CPI(M), he was periodically wooed by the TMC after it came to power in Bengal in 2011. But rumours about his joining politics reached a crescendo in 2021, when his name began doing the rounds as the probable BJP chief ministerial candidate, in case the party won the state polls.

Tourism sector in Odisha sees tremendous growth in last 4 yrs

G20 meet ends, Kashmiris hope for tourism revival



As the third G20 tourism working group concluded, with 60 delegates from 27 countries spending three days in Srinagar, expectations to see a boost in tourist footfall in the Valley from some to these countries has risen among local residents. On the last day, the delegates were taken to several tourist spots across Srinagar to give them an overview of what the city has to offer. In the last financial year, Jammu and Kashmir received 1.88 crore tourists, according to the Tourism Department's figures. Even as a majority of them were Vaishno Devi-bound pilgrims, officials said the Valley got nearly 26 lakh tourists. They are now hoping this high-level summit will make international travellers aware about the safety aspect and restart the process for some of these countries to withdraw negative travel advisories on Kashmir.

J&K Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said representatives from some of the countries that have issued such advisories were present at the meeting.

Stating that South Korea "supports India's presidency of the G20", the country's ambassador to India, Jae Boo Chang, told , "There are some limitations to come here and we need special permits, but it was a pleasure to be here."
